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APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA

<u>Minutes:</u> **A MOTION** was made by S. Rude and seconded by Vice Chairman E. Hayes, with all members in favor, to approve the January 19, 2021 meeting minutes.

Sussex County Health Department Report for December 2020:

Chairman D. Hansen requested that the Safe water Complaint Investigation on 12/15/2020 at Hampton Township Municipal, The Public Health Nuisance Complaint on 12/23/2020 at 45 Route 521 and the DEP Emergency Response Action on 12/29/2020 at 213 Highland Ave be removed from the Consent Agenda for further consideration.

Sussex County Health Department Report for January 2021:

Chairman D. Hansen and N. Walker requested that the Safe water Complaint Investigation on 1/15/2021 at 20 Hampton House Road and the Complaint Investigation on 1/19/2021 at Villa Capri be removed from the Consent Agenda for further consideration.

A MOTION was made by Vice Chairman E. Hayes and seconded by N. Walker, with all members in favor, to approve the Consent Agenda as listed above with the items referenced removed for further consideration.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS TO BE DISCUSSED SEPARATELY

Safe Water Complaint on 12/15/2020 at Hampton Municipal

Secretary V. Ingles stated that when the routine water sampling was done at the Municipal Complex that the water in the Municipal Building came up positive for total coliform. She had to prepare a level 2 assessment and D. Bayles put together a journal for routine maintenance to the water softener. The filter needed to be changed and possibly caused the issue. The water test came back normal after that. No further action needed.

Complaint Investigation on 12/23/2020 at 45 Route 521

Health Inspector C. Whitehead stated that this was a complaint from the renter at 45 Route 521 that they had no running water. She could not reach her landlord to get the matter fixed. Health Inspector M. McGill attempted to call the owner however there was no answer and the voicemail was full. She reached out to the tenants and provided contact information for the Division of Social Services. She stated that she would try to contact the landlord again and sent a Notice of Violation to the property owner.

DEP Emergency Response Action on 12/29/2020 at 213 Highland Ave

Health Inspector C. Whitehead stated that she didn't have the information at home and asked Secretary V. Ingles to read the report on that complaint. Secretary V. Ingles stated that a resident called in reporting a backhoe leaking some type of oil and that the rain had washed it

into the storm drains. Health Inspector Z. Faiola visited the responsible party and met with the owner who brought him to the backhoe. Z. Faiola did not smell oil and was unable to see any sheen or oil under backhoe. He noted a police cruiser parked out front with damage to the front and grill of the vehicle. He investigated the vehicle as a possible other source. The resident stated that the vehicle was totaled and the insurance company would be by later that day to tow it. No sheen or odor was observed under the police cruiser either. No further action needed.

Safe Water Complaint Investigation on 1/15/2021 at Kia

Secretary V. Ingles explained that this report appeared to just be correspondence. The Kia dealership was previously known as Newton Kia/Kia of Sussex but has changed names and is now called Major Kia. The owner of the dealership also changed hands and opened remotely. There were no water results in for the 2nd, 3rd and 4th quarter of 2020, which the Health Department was told that the building was vacant during that time.

Complaint Investigation on 1/19/2021 at Villa Capri

Health Inspector C. Whitehead stated that this was a complaint about the amount of debris located behind Villa Capri Pizza. She stated that the Chinese restaurant showed Health Inspector T. Bailey where around the dumpster area and also on the ground behind the strip mall. T. Bailey observed long rolls and pizza. He spoke with Villa Capri owner Mike Collins and asked him to have the bread, pizza and other food debris removed from the ground. He informed M. Collins that as the owner of the business that he is responsible for keeping his area clean. T. Bailey also followed up by contacting the NJ Conservation Officer Adam Merritt to determine if this area is part of the Federal Wildlife Refuge. Mr. Merritt also spoke with M. Collins regarding the importance of keeping the Wildlife Refuge clean and to prevent attracting bears and other animals to the area. T. Bailey went back to check on the area and observed the entire area was cleaned up. No further action needed.

A MOTION was made by S. Rude and seconded by Vice Chairman E. Hayes, with all members in favor, to approve the items removed from the Consent Agenda.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Update: 2019 Retail Food Establishment Licenses, Vending Machine Licenses & Pet Shop/Kennel Licenses: Valerie Ingles, Board of Health Secretary.

Secretary V. Ingles stated that the Newton Vet is the only place to not doing their annual licensing to date, they owe their 2021 Kennel License. Chairman D. Hansen stated to give the Newton Vet a violation.

NEW BUSINESS

T. Berkheiser stated that he attended the Recreation Committee meeting last month and concern was brought up regarding the use of the park well and concession stand. He stated that V. Ingles sent over the file on everything done to do with the well at the park since the new well

had been installed so that he could review it. He asked if there was any sort of plan as to how to get the well up and running.

Chairman D. Hansen stated that the next plan is to try to run a service line to the park from the DPW. The Township Engineer would need to do pressure tests and cost estimates to see if that would be possible. He stated if that wasn't an option then possibly having a UV light system installed.

T. Berkheiser suggested using the NJ Local Board of Health as a resource for help. He suggested possibly looking into more professional help as to why the water in the back keeps failing.

Vice Chairman E. Hayes suggested that maybe the DPW could use the water from the well in the park for their big DPW jobs i.e. the street sweepers and washing trucks. He stated that otherwise they do use a lot of water during the day and then if the water was being run in the evenings and weekends as well that it may be too much on one well.

Chairman D. Hansen stated that the next Board of Health meeting would be in May via Zoom.

CORRESPONDENCE

1. New Jersey Local Board of Health Membership Renewal For 2021

A MOTION was made by T. Berkheiser, and seconded by Vice Chairman E. Hayes, with all members in favor, to approve the 2021 full board membership to the New Jersey Local Board of Health Association for \$95.

2. GZA GeoEnvironmental Inc., Remediation update for Gasarama of Newton.

Chairman D. Hansen stated that the spill occurred on 8/1/2005. This notice was for the 2nd remedial action. Benzine had been spilled and the best course of action was to let it degrade naturally. The concentration has been going down. There will be about 7 years of additional testing.
