Great American Smokeout




This year the Great American Smokeout took place on November 16, 2023. The Incorruptible.Us (a youth tobacco action group) team at Kittatinny Regional High School


hosted a lunchroom event with the Junior High and High School students. Resources to quit vaping were shared along with Great American Smokeout giveaways such as cups, yo-yos, bracelets, and stickers. All students were invited to draw or paint the outline of their hand on the paper and list their 5 reasons why they choose not to vape. Incorruptible.Us youth educate their peers and advocate for policy change in their school and community. Incorruptible.Us is an initiative of Tobacco Free for a Healthy NJ, a program of the NJ Department of Health and the Center for Prevention & Counseling.

Students Decorate Trees for the German Christmas Market

It is the most wonderful time of the year and to start the holiday season the German Christmas Market will be open Friday, December 1- Sunday, December 3rd. The market organizers reached out to local schools to have students decorate various

Christmas trees. Mrs. Anderson's 3D Art class, with some help from German teacher Ms. Peemoller, created paper stars to decorate a tree. Below is the information on the history of these special decorations.

Froebel Star (or Fröbelstern in german)

"Froebel stars are three-dimensional paper ornaments that German children used to make in school for the family's Christmas tree or wreath. Froebel stars are made by folding and interweaving paper strips without the use of glue. It is a form of origami. Four paper strips of identical length are folded and woven until a star with eight flat and eight cone-shaped points emerges."

"Froebel stars are named after the German educator Friedrich Froebel (1782-1852) who advocated paper folding for young children to introduce them to basic mathematical concepts. Recognizing that children have unique needs and capabilities, Froebel designed educational play materials known as Froebel Gifts. The "gifts" included circles, spheres and geometric building blocks. Most likely,

Friedrich Froebel did not invent Froebel stars, however, because descriptions of how to fold them date back to the 19th century or even further. But he used the

folding and weaving concept in his educational activities."

Brandon will attend most home Kittatinny sporting events and occasionally goes on the road whenever possible. We are hoping that Brandon's love and passion for all things Kittatinny will come full circle. You see, Brandon and his dad, Jim, have a modest home at Carriage Mobile Homes in Lafayette, NJ, and their home has come under disrepair. Several area residents and business owners have teamed up to assess the situation with Brandon and his dad.

Previous repairs have extended the life of their current home; however, the exterior of the home has become unsafe. Several options have been explored by this team, led by Tony Cerbo, Joe Fitzpatrick, & Dan Holdt, and they have concluded that Brandon and his dad need a new home. It is with this idea in mind that the team came up with "Brandon's House" as a local fundraising campaign to assist Brandon and his dad with this effort.

Local businesses, including Wilson Services and Wantage Excavating, are stepping up alongside local tradesmen like Electricians Mike Brucker and John DeSordi along with Plumber Steven Pisauro to disconnect and remove their old home from the Carriage Mobile Homes site and deliver and reestablish essential services to a new home from Champion Homes.

The team has set a goal of \$75,000. To date, we have already raised over \$7,000 with the help of area churches and local donations. We will be hosting events over the next few months, and we look forward to your participation in those events to help us reach our goal so that Brandon and Jim can have a safe, new home!

Paige DeCaro, Josie Nuzzo, and Charlie Lindo have taken up the task of getting the Kittatinny Cougars back on track with recycling. Their end goal would be to have us composting to use in the Cougar green house to serve fresh veggies to our school.

They began by researching both online and by talking with KRHS staff. Did you know the top three items found in landfills are:



- Food 21.9 percent
- Plastics 19.2 percent
- Paper 13.1 percent

So these three industrious students are reminding us of the three R's:

- Reduce
- Reuse
- Recycle

Items we can recycle:

- 1) Commingled Plastics: Plastic containers #1,#2, and #5 as well as glass, aluminum cans, tin, and steel
- 2) Cardboard: Pizza boxes, brown bags, and chipboard
- 3) Mixed Fiber: Chipboard such as cereal boxes, office paper, magazines, catalogs, and paperback books
- 4) Rigid Plastics: Laundry basket
- 5) Newspaper

Items that are not recyclable:

- Plastic bags
- Polystyrene
- Non-recyclable sign
- Clothing materials

Phase one has begun with collecting donations of old five gallon pails such as old spackle buckets. If you have a pail to donate, please reach out to Mr. Chamberlin.
