Dear Parent or Guardian:

Summer EBT is a new federal program to help families buy food for their school-aged children during the summer. Families will receive \$120 for each eligible child to buy groceries during the summer. Children who receive Summer EBT benefits can still participate in other summer meal programs. Receiving benefits will not affect children or families' immigration status.

In New Jersey, Summer EBT benefits will be loaded onto an EBT card and mailed to your home. If eligible, you can use the benefits to buy food like fruits, vegetables, meat, whole grains, and dairy at grocery stores, farmers markets, and other places that accept WIC or SNAP EBT benefits. Summer EBT is a convenient way for you to help your children thrive.

If your child is not automatically eligible through SNAP, TANF or Foster Care benefits and you did not complete and return a School Meals Application to your child's school, but believe your child may qualify, you are encouraged to complete a School Meals Application and submit it to your local school district no later than May 15, 2024, to see if you qualify for the Federal Summer EBT benefit prior to the start of summer.

Summer EBT is a convenient way for you to help your children thrive.

Is my child eligible for Summer EBT?

Your child is eligible for Summer EBT benefits if:

- Your household already receives SNAP, TANF, or Foster Care benefits,
OR
- Your child attends a school that participates in the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program, *and* your household income meets the requirements for federal free or federal reduced price school meals.

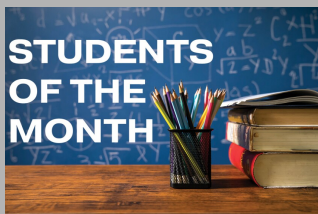

Important Senior Guidance Update

Dear Senior/Senior Parent:

With the senior year rapidly drawing to a close and graduation becoming a reality, school counselors will be releasing senior permanent record files starting sometime in June during lunch periods. If students do not pick up their permanent record files by June 28, 2024 these records will be destroyed unless written parental notification indicates otherwise. Mandated records will be kept by the school in perpetuity. The State of New Jersey is quite specific on what completed pupil records must be maintained.

In regards to the last several weeks of instruction, if your student is struggling in any of their classes, please monitor the parent portal and check in with teachers and school counselors regarding their status. Final grades and attendance could affect a student's graduation status and the student/parent may not be notified until the day of graduation.

If need be, summer school is being offered to high school students through Kittatiny's approved online program. School counselors can help with this process once grades are finalized.

Senior Awards Night is planned for Tuesday, June 4 at 5:00 p.m. in the Peter A. Mahler Performing Arts Theater. Seniors who will be receiving awards will be notified ahead of time through the Guidance Office.

Final report cards will be mailed home in late June. If applicable, a final transcript will automatically be sent to the college your student plans to attend (barring any student

obligations).

This past Saturday, The Kittatinny TSA chapter competed in their 39th State competition at the College of NJ. We are the second oldest chapter in the state of NJ. This is the first in-person competition we have attended since Covid-19. The rewards were hard-earned and the results were gratifying. NJ-TSA has grown in numbers to have a record-breaking 1,729 students from 66 schools competing in 40 events. Kittatinny was represented this year by 7 students in 6 events.

Awards were earned by:

Delaney Taylor who placed second in the state for architectural design (her second year in a row)

Bradley Kearny and Earlie Soehl for Placing Third in the state for CAD Engineering.

Our students won more events than any other Sussex Country school and Kittatinny had the highest-placed student with Delaney Taylor receiving second place for Architectural Design.

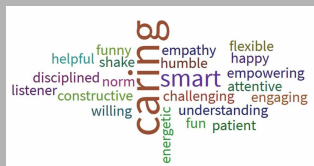
